### Welcome to St Thomas' Cathedral for this service

"Fear not, O land; be glad and rejoice, for the Lord has done great things!" (Joel 2. 21)

Rogation Sunday is the day when the Church has traditionally offered prayers for God's blessings on the fruits of the earth and the labours of those who produce our food. The word "rogation" is from the Latin rogare, "to ask." Historically, the Rogation Days (the three days before Ascension Day) were a period of fasting and abstinence, beseeching God's blessing on the crops for a bountiful harvest. Few of us today directly derive our livelihood from the production of food, yet it is good to be reminded of our dependence upon those who do and our responsibility for the environment.
