Welcome to St Thomas' Cathedral for this service

All Saints' Day is on 1st November & All Souls' Day on 2nd November

No Christian is solitary. Through baptism we become members one of another in Christ, members of a company of saints whose mutual belonging transcends death

All Saints' Day and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed on All Souls' Day both celebrate this mutual belonging. All Saints' Day celebrates men and women in whose lives the Church as a whole has seen the grace of God powerfully at work. The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed celebrates the saints in a more local and intimate key. It allows us to remember with thanksgiving before God those whom we have known more directly: those who gave us life, or who nurtured us in faith.

Redemption is a work of God's grace; it is God who redeems us in Christ and there is nothing to be done beyond what Christ has done. But we still wait for the final consummation of God's new creation in Christ; those who are Christ's, whether or not they have passed through death, are joined in prayer that God's Kingdom will be revealed finally and in all its fullness.

The last Sunday in October is also observed as *Reformation Sunday*. We are indebted to the Reformer's courageous stand for the purity of the Gospel over against virtually all civil and ecclesiastical forces of their day, armed only with an unshakable confidence in God and His Word. Many were persecuted; some paid with their lives. We remember them.

Do not leave this service booklet behind. Take it home with you to reflect on the prayers and readings and as a reminder of your visit.
