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THANKSGIVING FOR THE HOLY EUCHARIST Reflections on Harvest Festival

Theologically speaking the Eucharist is a harvest festival. Because we offer fruits of the earth and of human labour at every Eucharist. Bread is made out of wheat flour. People work hard to get the harvest of wheat. Wine is made out of grapes. Again people toil hard to get the harvest of grapes from the creeping plant of vine. Here we see how God offers the flesh and blood of His Son through our harvest for our spiritual nourishment.


