### TEXT FOR THE DAY

*And now these three remain: faith, hope and love.*

*But the greatest of these is love. ~ I Corinthians 13:13*

February is a month synonymous with love. The shops will be full of cards for Valentine's Day – we get to celebrate, thank, and declare our love to someone we know.

I Corinthians:13 in the Bible is all about love. The word for love used here is also '*agape*' (in the original Greek). It's an active love, not just a feeling. The passage reminds us that without this love, life loses its meaning and shine; we become simply a resounding gong or clanging cymbal. This love is our response to God's saving work in Jesus. '*Agape*' love is expressed in our lives through loving God and loving our neighbours as ourselves. Many people haven't yet heard of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and of God's love for them.

Where are we, as churches and as individuals, being called to express God's love today?


