The resurrection of Christ inaugurated the new way of the Kingdom, which Jesus proclaimed was “at hand”. The Kingdom of God is an alternative society for those who seek to live under the rule and reign of the government of God, where the reality of Heaven will become fully true on earth. The Kingdom of God is a shelter from the storm of the current state of affairs, until the day when the kingdoms of this world will become the Kingdom of our God, and of the increase of His government and of peace there shall be no end (Isaiah 9:7).

In light of all of this, the extent to which we love one another today will show the world how much we believe in what happened on Easter Day, how much we believe that the Kingdom is truly at hand.

The seven week celebration of Easter leads us into Pentecost, which signifies the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. May your heart be ignited this Eastertide by the joy and life that resurrection brings.
