"But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law."

Reflections on Paul's Letter to the Galatians 5. 22

The fruit of the Spirit is an inner grace that is produced in a believer who is submitted to the guidance of the Holy Spirit so that the life lived becomes a lovely reflection of Christ's singular nature and godly character.

The nine graces that together comprise the single, fruit of the Spirit, combine to display a perfect portrait of the Lord Jesus, Himself. Each of the nine individual qualities that are listed as the fruit of the Spirit, have their genesis in the fountain head of God's sacrificial LOVE. The triplet of love, joy, and peace, demonstrates an inner quality that permeates the entire disposition of the one that is producing this fruit of the Spirit, as they grow in grace and are being conformed into the image and likeness of Christ, through the power of the indwelling Spirit.

It is only as we grow in grace, become mature in the faith, and keep a short rein of sin in our lives, that we will produce the spiritual fruit. We will then be equipped to say with Paul, "It is not I who live - but Christ, Who lives in me."

Do not leave this service booklet behind. Take it home with you to reflect on the prayers and readings and as a reminder of your visit.
