Reflections on Matthew 6

Jesus recognizes the problem of possessions for his first-century audience.

He challenges people to take a position on wealth, a potential threat to God (*Matthew 6:24*). Wealth competes with God for the human heart.

In Jesus' example, God's care for nature is even more attentive than this unnatural acquisition of wealth. But the reality of life in the first century for many people was a challenge to acquire the necessities of life, like food and clothing, through laborious living. Yet, life is more than food and clothing.

To place effort in acquiring goods for one's self may distract from seeking righteousness and justice around us. Jesus' challenge to trust God for daily needs is exactly why he can say to those looking to do good, *"If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me"*. As Mother Teresa famously said, *"If you can't feed a hundred people, then feed just one."*

God will take care of you ... so take care of God's justice in the world

Japan has been impacted by Typhoon Namadol, forcing four million people to evacuate, and Taiwan has been struck by a magnitude 6.9 earthquake causing significant damage to structures, but thankfully it seems few lives have been lost. We pray for the plight of refugees everywhere who are unable to find peace and security in their own countries, and we continue to ask God for solutions to the problems of the Rohingyas in Bangladesh. We pray for an end to the impasse in Myanmar and the worsening humanitarian crisis.

† **OUR COUNTRY** For all marginalised sections of our society. May we translate the Gospel into action and reach out to the least of our bretheren.

† **THE WORLDWIDE CHURCH** With the Church universal, we give praise to God in union with all the hosts of heaven on the Feast of St Michael & All Angels (29th September). • In the *Anglican Communion* the Church of Burundi and the Most Revd Sixbert Macumi.

† **THE CHURCH IN INDIA**

In this the centenary year of the anniversary of her death, we thank God for the life and ministry of Pandita Ramabai, 1858-1922 (commemorated 29th September). She was a scholar, feminist, educator and social reformer. Pray for the work of Mukti Mission (in Kedgaon village near Pune) – a Christ centred home where destitute women and children irrespective of their background are accepted, cared for, transformed and empowered to be the “Salt & Light” in the society. This home was started by Pandita Ramabai in 1889. • The newly appointed Moderator of the *Church of North India* the Most Revd Bijay Kumar Nayak (Bishop of the Diocese of Phulbani, Odisha) • The Diocese of Madurai-Ramnad and the Rt Revd Jeyasingh Prince Prabhakaran.
