And Abraham answered and said,

"Now that I have been so bold as to speak to the Lord..." Reflections on Genesis 18.27

Whenever we think about or talk about God, there is a wonderful tension between certainty and mystery.

We use our reason and ecclesiastical traditions to develop frameworks for understanding who God is and how God can be expected to behave and act. Scripture itself confronts us with texts where God acts in ways that cannot be rationally explained away.

The themes of justice and righteousness becomes an important reason why Abraham intercedes the way he does. Abraham understands God as one who will act justly and righteously, and that understanding emboldens Abraham to pray the way he does.

The repetition of the particle, 'abur, "for the sake of," affirms that God is a God who acts for the sake of, on behalf of others.. Based on God's own words, we can say with certainty that God does not operate in a vacuum but out of concern and care for the sake of the righteous.

The flowers in the Sanctuary this morning are placed in loving memory of the late Mrs Chandramathi Moses (beloved mother of Dr Kamal Jadhav) in commemoration of her death anniversary.

Mr. Desmond Shaw served as the Principal of the Cathedral and John Connon School from 1986 to 1996. He was previously the Principal of La Martiniere College, Lucknow. Mr. Shaw passed away last week on Saturday 15th October 2022 in Canada where he and Mrs. Shaw had settled down with their daughters. He is survived by his wife Mrs. Mavis Shaw and daughters Carolyn, Corinne and Colleen. We give thanks to God for the many years of faithful service Mr. Shaw gave the Cathedral School as its Principal. Mr. and Mrs. Shaw were regular worshippers in the Cathedral. His funeral will be held today in St George's Church, Georgetown, Ontario.
