Thanksgiving for Holy Eucharist

Theologically speaking Eucharist is a harvest festival. Because we offer fruits of the earth and of human labour at every Eucharist. Bread is made out of wheat flour. People work hard to get the harvest of wheat. Wine is made out of grapes. Again people toil hard to get the harvest of grapes from the creeping plant of vine. Here we see how God offers the flesh and blood of His son through our harvest for our spiritual nourishment.

When we go a step further we can learn that all our worship services are harvest festivals. The theological word for worship is called liturgy and this word is derived from 2 Greek words called – λαός – laos (people) and – έργον – ergon (work) The result of work of people is harvest. Therefore in our worship we offer to God the harvest of our God given time, money and resources etc.

It is the belief of Christians that every Eucharist is a small Easter. Whenever we celebrate the Eucharist we are living in the resurrection of the Jesus Christ. Beginning from the early Christians up to date we meet the resurrected Christ in the Eucharist.

According to the theology in the letter of James (James 1:18) resurrected Christ is God's spiritual harvest and the first fruit of all he created.

† **THE WORLD** We give sincere thanks that at last, Russia is making a withdrawal from the Ukraine city of Kherson where Russian troops have been in occupation for eight months. We hope and pray, along with Ukrainians, that this will be a turning point of the war. • We give thanks for COP27 delegates meeting in Egypt from 6th to 18th November, and pray that lasting decisions to reverse climate change damage will be. • We thank God that a place of safety has been afforded to the distressed 250 refugees and migrants initially rejected by Italy. They were rescued from the Central Mediterranean by a humanitarian rescue ship.

• We pray for God's comfort for the people of Iran in light of the protests and violence after the death of Zhina Mahsa Amini. • We earnestly pray for governments to address measures to curb inflation and alleviate high energy costs.

† **OUR COUNTRY** Pray for the new Chief Justice of India as he assumes office. • For all in Government as India takes on the Presidency of G20. The focus will be on how to deal with food and energy insecurities. Pray that policies will always be inclusive and help the most vulnerable in our society.

† **THE WORLDWIDE CHURCH** • In many countries of the world the Sunday closest to 11th November (Armistice) is observed as *Remembrance Sunday*. We remember and honour the memory of those who have fallen in all wars. Bless those who strive for reconciliation, mediation and peace. In the *Anglican Communion* for the Diocese of Hokkaido (Japan) and the Right Revd Maria Grace Tazu Sasamori (Bishop Maria is Japan's first woman bishop.)

† **THE CHURCH IN INDIA** Today the *Communion of Churches in India* observe *Unity Sunday*. Pray for the Synods and leaders of the *Church of North India*, the *Church of South India* and the *Mar Thoma Syrian Church*.

† **THE DIOCESE OF BOMBAY** We particularly pray for the laity and pastorates of the Diocese. May they listen to the promptings of the Holy Spirit in decisions they make. • Emmanuel Marathi Church, Vasai and the Revd Graham Engineer.

† **OUR CATHEDRAL** Pray for God's comforting presence with all who are unwell, especially Mr. Alan Moses and Mr. David Roberts. • This week we pray for the pupils, staff, Principal and Board of Governors of the Cathedral and John Connon School as they observe their 162nd Founders' Day tomorrow. The School was founded in 1860 during the episcopacy of Bishop Harding (1851 - 1869) the second Bishop of Bombay.
