THE PURPOSE OF ADVENT

Joyful expectancy

We all like to welcome visitors, especially those who are close to us and those we love, and we sometimes find the waiting difficult. So we use the waiting

time to make our preparations. The same is true with our Christian Family.

Each year the Church reserves four weeks before Christmas in order to

give us time to make the necessary preparations. We call this season "Advent"

which means "coming" (from the Latin, Adventus).

A New Guinea Christian once put it this way: "At Advent we should try the

key to our heart's door. It may have gathered rust, if so, this is the time to oil it, in order

that the heart's door may open more easily when the Lord Jesus wants to enter at Christ-

mas Time."

Advent is the time of year when we prepare ourselves, as a Church and as

individual Christians, for the coming of Jesus – The one who came over 2000 years

ago, the one who comes again this Christmas and the one who will come again at

the end of time as King and judge of all.

O Wisdom, which camest out of the mouth of the most High, and reachest from one end to another, mightily, and sweetly ordering all things:

Come and teach us the way of prudence.

O ADONAÏ

O Adonai, and Leader of the house of Israel, who appearedst in the Bush to Moses in a flame of fire, and gavest him the law in Sinai:

Come and deliver us with an outstretched arm.

Each of the antiphons addresses Christ by one of His Scriptural names or titles, each one praises the coming of the Saviour by a different name, and each one closes with a petition appropriate to the title.

Seven days before Christmas Eve monasteries would sing the "O antiphons" in anticipation of Christmas Eve when the eighth antiphon, "O Virgo virginum" ("O Virgin of virgins") would be sung before and after Mary's canticle, the Magnificat (Luke 1:46b-55).

The Fellowship of the Least Coin (FLC) is a global ecumenical prayer movement for peace, justice, and reconciliation. Through this movement, women around the world strive to be in solidarity with each other and are reminded to pray and work for peace The idea for the FLC emerged as a vision from God to Shanti Solomon of India. Shanti had heard stories from Asian women who had experienced abuse and trauma during the Second World War. Shanti wanted all Christian women to pray for peace, justice, and reconciliation in their own lives and throughout the world and to set aside a coin as a token for each prayer. She proposed that all women give the "least coin" of their currency so that women of all socioeconomic status could be given opportunities to be generous and participate in this peace making. The team accepted Shanti's challenge and the FLC was born.



A service of compline for Advent



The First Sunday of Advent 27th November 2022 7 p.m.

A quiet, contemplative service of compline (a service of evening prayers said before retiring for the night) to prepare ourselves for the season. We will listen to ancient biblical prophecies about the coming of the Messiah, passages about the second coming of Christ, sing hymns and listen to choral and organ music for Advent.

The service will begin in darkness. The darkness giving way to light as candles are lit as the congregation moves around the Cathedral.
