

Our response to the Empty Tomb

Happy Easter! It is a joy and a pleasure to welcome you to the Cathedral on the greatest day of the Christian

year.

Easter is one of those occasions on which most folks come to church already knowing the story. Due to the familiarity with the Easter narratives, it might only be natural for some of us to let our minds wander during the

reading of the scriptures!

The resurrection account from John's Gospel provides an interesting account of how the first witnesses to the

empty tomb respond. Mary Magdalene, Peter, and John each react differently. Do we in any way see a reflection

of ourself in the response of Mary Magdalene, Peter and John? It can be tempting for us to try to identify with

the major players in this or any of our more familiar scriptures. There is nothing inherently wrong with the de-

sire to relate to a particular individual in this or any other biblical passage. But by doing so, we may run the risk

of limiting our perspective when instead we are called to expand it.

Are we not, some combination of John, Peter, and Mary Magdalene? We are John when we see something and

believe it. We are Peter when we are not quite as certain. We are Mary when a loved one dies and our grief

overwhelms our other senses. We find ourselves in different places on our Christian journey at different times.

That's just fine.

Even on Easter.

You might well be able to run toward the empty tomb with an undefended heart, predisposed to belief even

before you get a look at the evidence. Or perhaps once you arrive, you will need to turn away in confusion. You

simply might need to take some time to sort out what has happened and then come back later.

None of our possible responses changes the truth of the matter - that whoever you are, wherever you are, Je-

sus is right there by your side.

Whether you are a regular member of a Christian community or just visiting today with family and friends, the

joy of Easter was intended for you. It is God's gift to you, God's promise that your life has immeasurable mean-

ing and value because you are loved.

We hope that you too will find yourself resurrected on this Easter morning. For you are precious in God's sight,

you are loved more than you will ever know, and God's love will never let you go. Christ is risen! Happy Easter!



THE HOLY GOSPEL St John 20:1 - 10

When the Gospel is announced, we sing: Glory to you, O Lord.

The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalen early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre. Then she runneth and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, they have taken away the Lord out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid Him. Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre. IT is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God.

BUT chiefly are we bound to praise Thee for the glorious Resurrection of Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord: For He is the very Paschal Lamb, which was offered for us, and hath taken away the sin of the world; Who by His death hath destroyed death, and by His rising to life again hath restored to us everlasting life.

THEREFORE with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify Thy glorious name; evermore praising Thee, and saying,

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The people kneeling, the Celebrant shall then continue

Holy in truth art Thou, and blessed in truth, O Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that Thou of Thy tender mercy didst give Thine only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon Him, and to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there, by His one oblation of Himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in His holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memorial of that His precious death, until His coming again:

Who, in the same night that He was betrayed, took Bread; and when He had given thanks to Thee, He brake it, and gave it to His disciples, saying, take, eat, this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me.

Likewise after supper He took the Cup; and, when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of this: for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me. **Amen.**

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father
we Thy humble servants do celebrate and make here before Thy Divine Majesty,
with these Thy holy gifts,
the memorial Thy Son hath commanded us to make;
having in remembrance His blessèd passion, and precious death,

rendering unto Thee most hearty thanks for the same,
and looking for His coming again with power and great glory,

And we entirely desire Thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept on high this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, beseeching Thee to grant, that by the merits and death of Thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in His blood, we and all Thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of His passion.

And we humbly beseech Thee, most merciful Father, to send down Thy holy and life- giving Spirit upon us and upon these Thy gifts, that the Bread which we break may be the communion of the Body of Christ, and the Cup which we bless may be the communion of His Blood; and grant, that all we who are partakers of this Holy communion may be fulfilled with Thy grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body in Thy Son, Our Saviour Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

THE PRAYER OF HUMBLE ACCESS

All

WE do not presume to come to this Thy Table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in Thy manifold and great mercies.

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under Thy table. But Thou art the same Lord, whose property is always to have mercy: Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the Flesh of Thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink His Blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by His Body, and our souls washed through His most precious Blood, and that we may evermore dwell in Him, and He in us. Amen.

Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us, Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us, Jesus, redeemer of the world, grant us peace.

The Celebrant addresses them that come to receive the Holy Communion:

DRAW near and receive the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, which were given for you, and feed on Him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

Communicants proceed to the High Altar

And when the Celebrant delivers the Bread, he shall say:

The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was given for thee, preserve thy body and soul unto everlasting life.

Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for thee, and feed on Him in thy heart by faith with thanksgiving.

And the Minister that delivers the Cup says:
