Incidentally it was on St. Matthew's day 1714 that the Reverend Richard Cobbe, Chaplain appointed by the East India Company, arrived in Bombay (after an almost six month voyage.) Revd. Cobbe was instrumental in raising the muchneeded funds for the completion of the building of St. Thomas' Church 1718); which later was elevated to the status of a cathedral (1837), the seat of the Bishop of Bombay.
