Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise,

Ephesians 5:15

As Christians, we must always be aware that this life is not all that there is. And this life is short! We have an eternal hope in heaven with Christ that this life is moving towards, but we aren't there yet. So, we must live well while we are here. We must live intentionally.

Be aware of foolish pitfalls and continue to grow in wisdom. Paul tells us that wise living that understands God's will means to be "filled by the Spirit."

Don't be defensive when you are called out for sin; humbly submit to others, repent, and grow as a Christian. Learn from those who are stronger in faith. Seek out a mentor to teach you how to respond to the gospel in everyday life.

Wise living is living by the Holy Spirit. Wise living is being sensitive to God's word to us in the scripture and doing what it says.

The Cathedral and John Connon School is opening its newest building, Thomas House, on Monday 30th October 2023.

The Cathedral and John Connon School was founded in 1860. It began as a humble establishment when Bishop John Harding (the second Bishop of Bombay) and the Cathedral Chaplain decided to start a small Grammar school for boys and one for girls within the walled city of Bombay. In 1875 a choir school was established with the primary objective of providing choristers for St. Thomas's Cathedral.

We give thanks to God for all those who down the centuries have contributed to the life and work of the school which over the years has produced several illutrious allumni.
