

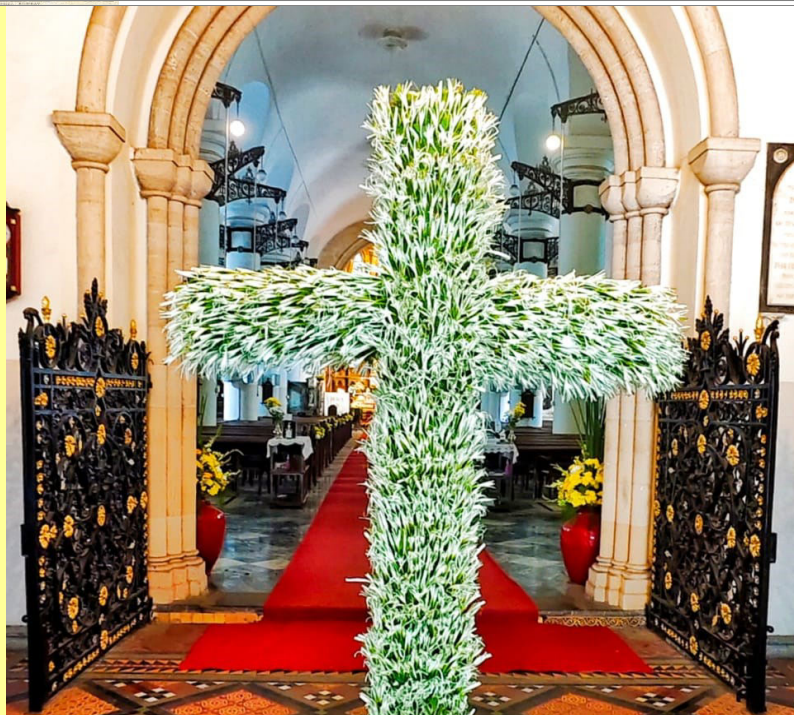

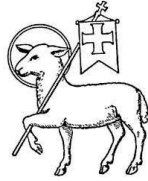

THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST

Happy Easter!

It is a joy and a pleasure to welcome you to the Cathedral on the greatest day of the Christian year. For more than two thousand years the good news of the risen Christ has been a source of hope and healing for Christians the world over. The proclamation that Christ is risen, and the promise that one day we too will rise from the grave, has been and continues to be the animating force that enables Christians to love and serve in extraordinary ways. Easter is our *raison d'être*. The Church exists for the sole purpose of sharing this extraordinary news that the tomb is empty; Jesus is alive, and death has been defeated. The love of God covers everything, and even though we die, there is life beyond this life.

But Easter is not just about what happened to Jesus two thousand years ago or what happens to us after we die. On Easter, we also celebrate that the resurrected Christ lives among us now, opening the tombs that we create for ourselves—the tombs of anger, addiction, despair, hatred, and self-absorption. As members of the body of Christ, we are invited to love him, listen to him, follow him, and, in so doing, discover new lives of love, hope, meaning, and purpose. What happened to Jesus on Easter morning is happening every day in the lives of those who follow him. We are delighted that you are here today, and we hope that you too will find yourself resurrected on this Easter morning. For you are precious in God's sight, you are loved more than you will ever know, and God's love will never let you go. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

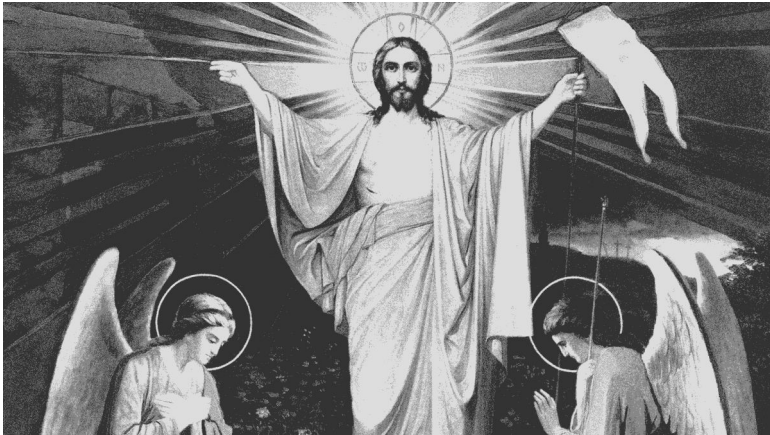

† **THE CHURCH IN INDIA** Bishop Reginald Heber (Evangelist and Bishop of Calcutta 1823 - 26) is commemorated on 3rd April. Heber is probably best remembered as the author of the hymn "*Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty*". He is buried in St. John's Church, Trichy, Tamil Nadu. The Bishop Heber College at Trichy is named after him • Bishop Ambrose of Milan is commemorated on 4th April. Ambrose is regarded as one of the Eight Great Doctors (Teachers) of the Undivided Church • Reverend Charles Freer Andrews (Evangelist) is commemorated on 5th April. Andrews was an English priest of the Church of England and a Christian missionary and social reformer in India. He was instrumental in convincing Gandhiji to return to India from South Africa, where Gandhiji had been a leading light in its Indian civil rights struggle. C. F. Andrews was affectionately dubbed *Christ's Faithful Apostle* by Gandhi, based on his initials. For Andrews's contributions to the Indian Independence Movement Gandhi and his students at St. Stephen's College, Delhi named him *Deenabandhu*, or "Friend of the Poor". Charles Andrews died in Calcutta on 5th April and is buried there •
