

Rogation Sunday is the day when the Church has traditionally offered prayers for God's blessings on the fruits of the earth and the labours of those who produce our food. The word "rogation" is from the Latin rogare, "to ask." Historically, the Rogation Days (the three days before Ascension Day) were a period of fasting and abstinence, beseeching God's blessing on the crops for a bountiful harvest.

Rogation provides us with the opportunity to praise the Creator God, give thanks for our food and those who produce it; to pray a

blessing on the communities in which we live and share together. Let us celebrate however we can, in thankfulness for all we have been given.
