TEXT FOR THE DAY

"Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus, by their fruit you will recognize them." Matthew 7: 19, 20

Jesus warns us in this gospel passage to beware of false prophets, instructing us that we shall know them by their fruits. What sort of fruit should we be looking for? The fruits of the Spirit are love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (*Galatians 5:22* -23). These are the good fruits born of true discipleship in Christ. We can expect the personal lives of false prophets to be marked by an absence of these things (though they may project a false image of them). Moreover, following their false teachings will fail to produce these fruits in our own lives.

The same criteria Jesus gives to discern false prophets also applies to the affections of our heart. What sort of fruit does this interest, hobby or pastime produce in my life? Is it drawing me closer to God? Is it helping me to love my neighbour? It is disposing me to be a better friend, parent, brother, sister, or spouse? Is it building holy relationships? Is it teaching me discipline? Is it bringing me peace?

When we consider the various branches of activity and interest in our own lives, perhaps there are some that need pruning, to allow more of our affection to flow toward pursuits that will yield the fruits of true devotion.


