REFLECTIONS FOR THE DAY

Watch carefully, then, how you walk...

Ephesians 5:15

As we walk our Christian walk, Paul says, we need to "watch carefully" how we do it. The word translated "carefully" is a word for accuracy and precision. It means to be exact and meticulous. In other words, living the Christian life isn't just about having big goals and dreams and plans. It's also about the details. It's about making sure we're taking particular care as we put one foot after another, day by day. Paul says that we need to be considered and careful about the nature of our Christian walk. We need to look out, pay attention, take care, think and consider how we walk.

> Watch carefully, then, how you walk, not as unwise but as wise people, reclaiming the time, because the days are evil. So don't be foolish, but grasp what the Lord's will is.

[†] **THE WORLDWIDE CHURCH** On 15th October the Church commemorates the 16th century nun and mystic Teressa of Avila. Teresa was a prominent Spanish mystic, Carmelite nun, and theologian of contemplative life through mental prayer. She was a reformer of the Carmelite Order. Teresa is revered as the *Doctor of Pray*er. The mysticism in her works exerted a formative influence upon many theologians of the following centuries • Henry Martyn (Evangelist) is remembered on 16th October. Martyn was an Anglican priest and missionary to the peoples of India and Persia. He arrived in India in April 1806, where he preached and occupied himself in the study of linguistics. Martyn translated the whole of the New Testament into Urdu, Persian and Judaeo-Persic. He also translated the Psalms into Persian and the *Book of Common Prayer* into Urdu. An institution was established in his name in Hyderabad, called the *Henry Martyn Institute: An Interfaith Centre for Reconciliation and Research* • In the Anglican Communion, for The Episcopal Church in the Philippines and Archbishop Brent Alawas.
