

We are the mother church of the Diocese of Bombay in the Church of North India, a member of the worldwide Anglican Communion. For over 300 years, the people of St. Thomas' Cathedral have sought to be a body through which the light of Christ is seen, his life is shared, and his work is done.

The basis for our worship is the *Book of Common Prayer*, our common liturgical heritage with Anglicans across the world (all churches descended from the Church of England). 

[†] THE WORLDWIDE CHURCH We give thanksgiving for St. Stephen the first martyr (26th December) and his faithful witness to lesus • St. John the Evangelist is commemorated on 27th December. St. John the Evangelist put Christmas in one verse: "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). Not martyred but still a witness, John was exiled to Patmos and died an old man, according to tradition. He bore witness "to the Word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw." (Revelation 1:2) • Yesterday (28th December) was the Feast of the Holy Innocents, when the church remembers the massacre of innocent children recounted in Matthew's gospel (2:16–18) when King Herod ordered the execution of all male children who are two years old and under in the vicinity of Bethlehem, in an attempt to remove any threat to his rule from what he believed to be a new King (lesus) born in Bethlehem. This day has become associated with remembering innocent people who have lost their lives in times of violence, in our own time, and a chance to pray for children and for an end to injustice • In the Anglican Communion, for The Episcopal Church of the United States of America and the Presiding Bishop the Most Reverend Sean W. Rowe.
