And God is faithful; He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will also provide a way out so that you can endure it.

| Corinthians | 0: | 3

In I Corinthians 10:1-13 Paul includes a rather bizarre retelling of Israel's exodus to illustrate for the Corinthians their own precarious position as a church living in a wilderness time — a limbo of sorts between their newfound freedom in Christ and the waited fruition of God's kingdom. In this period of waiting, Paul urges the floundering church to learn from the mistakes of their "ancestors" and to be faithful to God.

Paul is concerned that some may turn away from the faith. The actions of the ones who know better could cause their brothers or sisters, who are less certain that there is only one God and one Lord, to resort to their former religious commitments and, thus, to abandon their life in Christ.

The same Spirit that sustained the people of God in the wilderness period is the Spirit that sustains the church.
